

Chief Warrant Officer Three William H. Tuttle 4 December 1950 - 4 October 1983

Chief Warrant Officer Three William H. Tuttle was born on 4 December 1950 in Nogales, Arizona. He served at Fort Rucker, Alabama, before arriving at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, as an instructor pilot for Charlie Company, 158th Aviation Battalion in 1982.

CW3 Tuttle died on 4 October 1983 while serving as an instructor pilot of a UH-60A Black Hawk helicopter, #999, when it crashed in the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Panama. The subsequent rescue mission failed to recover CW3 Tuttle's remains.

CW3 Tuttle is survived by his wife, Diana; daughter, Josie; and son, Dominic. He is memorialized in Phoenix, Arizona, at National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona, Section MA, Site 432.
